



Council Reform Survey Results




#### Where do you live in the Bland Shire?

While the majority of respondents (72.4%) live in West Wyalong or Wyalong, more than a quarter of respondents reside in village or rural communities.


# In the past year have you contacted Council, an elected member or the Mayor for other reason than the payment of rates?

More than half of respondents have had personal contact with Council during the past 12 months.


# Prior to reading this survey, were you aware of the NSW Government's Fit for the Future reform packages for Local Government?

#### If Bland Shire was to merge with another Council, what are your preferences (Please rank from 1 to 5) – BEC



### Do you think the Bland Shire merging with a neighbouring Shire will imrpove the delivery of services to our community



Only 10.9% of respondents believe a merged Council will improve the delivery of services to the Bland Shire community.


### To what extent would you agree or disagree with the following statements relating to a new larger council?

A merged Council will deliver better local infrastructure and services





Respondents do not believe that a merged Council will deliver better local infrastructure and services.




Skipped: 3
