APPLICATION FOR RATES INCREASE TO BE LODGED WITH IPART

Maitland City Council will proceed with an application to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) to increase total rates revenue by 7.25% each year for seven years.

Councillors voted on Tuesday 11 February 2014 to formalise an application to IPART for the rating increase which would see average residential rates rise by \$71 in 2014/15.

The decision came after ten months of community consultation and is lower than initially proposed late last year.

General Manager David Evans says 'Council listened to community concerns and worked to minimise the increase while demonstrating Council's commitment to productivity and ability to still deliver the package of services the community wanted to see.

'Council has made a decision to increase borrowings, using loans to fund appropriate infrastructure renewal works. This has been complemented by a more ambitious grant funding targets'.

Council has also introduced an annual productivity target of \$500,000 each year commencing in 2015/16.

Under the seven year application, average residential rates would rise by \$95 each year, business by \$390 and farmland (high intensity) by \$95.

Should the application to IPART be approved, services would be maintained and in some areas enhanced. Recreational cycleways, roads and footpaths, sporting facilities, public amenities and access to the Hunter River are amongst the areas targeted for improvement.

Council also considered a reviewed hardship and debt recovery framework with three policies to be placed on public exhibition.

'Council asked for a review of the existing policy in December last year and have developed a new approach to ensure there are options in place to assist individuals experiencing genuine periods of hardship.

'It's important that people speak to Council as soon as they anticipate they will face difficulties so that a plan can be organised to suit their needs,' said Mr Evans.

Council is also working to increase community awareness of the payment options available to all ratepayers which can be structured to suit household budgets. BPay and direct debit options are available by the week, fortnight or month.

Council officers will now work to finalise a comprehensive application to IPART which will be supported by the Delivery Program 2013-17 (Revised), Operational Plan 2014/15, Resourcing Strategy and a range of other documentation.

Applications are due to IPART on 24 February 2014 and will be made available on the IPART and Council websites. IPART will release its determinations in June 2014.

NEW DELIVERY PROGRAM AND OPERATIONAL PLAN FOR CITY

Maitland City Council has reconfirmed its commitment to changes to Central Maitland, an upgraded aquatics centre and enhanced roads and footpaths with the adoption of the Delivery Program 2013-17(Revised) and Operational Plan 2014/15 at its meeting tonight.

The Delivery Program details what the community can expect to see delivered by Council over the period to help achieve the goals set out by residents in the Community Strategic Plan Maitland +10.

The Operational Plan presents a series of annual actions along with Council's \$94.7 million budget, fees and charges, rating structure and revenue policy.

General Manager David Evans says that the Program 'outlines actions that will ensure Council continues to provide quality services, facilities and programs that are integral to the City in which we live.

'Key projects over the next four years include a 25m indoor pool at Maitland Aquatic Centre, The Levee in Central Maitland and a new transport hub at Maitland Station'.

Maitland will also welcome new skate parks and playgrounds as well as improved access to the Hunter River and new off road cycleways.

'A new waste strategy is also in development which will result in changes in how the community manages household waste which in turn will help reduce the waste going to landfill,' said Mr Evans.

Mayor Cr Peter Blackmore says that this Program was one of the most ambitious he had seen in his 25 years in local government.

'It is wonderful to be leading a growing city with a Program like this which will continue to make Maitland a great place to live, work and invest,' said Cr Blackmore.

The documents have been completed earlier than usual to align with Council's Special Rate Variation application which is due to IPART on 24 February 2014.

The Delivery Program and accompanying Operational Plan 2014/15 were placed on public exhibition in December following a decision to advise the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) of Council's intention to apply for a special rate variation. Under the application average residential rates would rise by \$71 in 2014/15.
