



## Kooragang Water Pty Ltd applications for WIC Act licences

4 May 2022

## 1 Topic

Kooragang Water Pty Ltd (KWPL), a subsidiary of WUA MidCo Pty Ltd (WUA) has applied for a network operator's licence and a retail supplier's licence, under the *Water Industry Competition Act 2006* (NSW) (the WIC Act).

The applications are for the existing Kooragang Industrial Water Scheme which provides recycled water to Orica, an industrial customer at Kooragang Island, in the Newcastle local government area.

IPART is seeking comments from stakeholders as part of our assessment of KWPL's applications.

## 2 Background

The Kooragang Industrial Water Scheme processes treated effluent sourced from Hunter Water's Shortland Wastewater Treatment Works to produce high-quality recycled water. The recycled water is supplied to Orica on Kooragang Island for onsite industrial uses.

The scheme is owned by KWPL and currently operated by Suez Water Pty (Suez). Suez is currently the network and retail licensee for the scheme and has operated the scheme since 2016. If granted, the licence would be issued to KWPL and Suez will continue to operate the scheme under contract to KWPL.

KWPL has applied:

- to become the licensee for the scheme (both network and retail licences), and
- to increase the network licence area of operations to supply recycled water to Newcastle Coal on Kooragang Island.

There will be no change to the retail supplier licence area of operations.

If granted, the network operator's licence would authorise KWPL to operate and maintain the water industry infrastructure. The retail supplier's licence would authorise KWPL to provide retail services for drinking water and recycled water to Orica, and recycled water services to Newcastle Coal.
