

### Draft maximum rank and hail taxi fares

#### 4 March 2025

The NSW Government has asked IPART to review and make *recommendations* on the **maximum fares for rank and hail taxi services** that Transport for NSW will consider when determining the fares order to apply from 1 July 2025.

Fares for rank and hail taxi services are regulated to protect passengers from being charged excessive fares. Booked taxi fares are not regulated, as passengers have the opportunity to shop around for alternatives such as rideshare or other taxi services.

Our Draft Report details the draft recommendations we have made for urban and country fares schedules.

# Fares should be set so passengers get the rank and hail services they want at an appropriate price

For most types of trips, we found that taxi supply was satisfactory to meet passenger demand, suggesting that fares are around the right level. However, in the following situations we found that there was either excess supply or excess demand for taxi services:



Wheelchair accessible services

We found that there is significant unmet demand and excessive waiting times for passengers.



Services for passengers travelling short distances We found that there was undersupply caused by drivers refusing to supply services.



Services for passengers leaving Sydney Airport

We found there is excess supply of taxis, as evidenced by taxis sometimes waiting hours for a passenger, and evidence of over-charging behaviour by taxi drivers.

We therefore considered ways to adjust fares to address these issues.

#### **Draft recommended urban fares**

We are recommending an increase in the flag fall and waiting time and a decrease in the distance rate to apply after the first 12 km. Our draft fare recommendation also includes a 2.2% increase in all components to reflect 2024/25 CPI.

#### **Draft recommended country fares**

We are recommending a small increase in the flag fall and waiting time, as well as an overall 2.2% CPI increase to the country fare schedule. This means that all maximum rank and hail fares in the country fare area will be slightly higher than their current levels.

#### Increase to the Wheelchair Accessible Taxi Driver Incentive Subsidy (WATDIS)

We acknowledge the NSW Government's recent package of reforms to improve the availability of wheelchair accessible taxis (WATs). We endorse the proposed \$10 WATDIS increase (from \$15 to \$25) and additional rates for night and public holidays.

## We also recommend a trial of fixed taxi fares for trips from Sydney Airport to the Sydney CBD

In November 2024, the Minister for Transport requested us to consider a pricing methodology for taxi fares from Sydney Airport to different destinations, including the CBD. This is a complex task with many variables to consider.

To better assess Sydney Airport fares and the impacts on passengers and industry, we recommend a trial of flat fares for taxis caught from ranks situated outside all airport terminals to any location in the 2000 postcode. We recommend that the trial flat fare is **inclusive of road tolls**, **passenger service levy**, **and the airport access fee**, and set at

#### We are recommending a requirement for more detailed passenger receipts

To ensure fare transparency for customers, we are making a draft recommendation for rank and hail taxi receipts to include a clear breakdown of the fare and other cost components, including tolls, passenger service levy, and other charges if applicable.

#### We seek feedback on our draft recommendations

We want to hear from all interested parties to help inform our final recommendations. Our Draft Report contains specific questions which we seek stakeholder comment on. **Submissions to the Draft Report are due by 1 April 2025**.
