



NSW public and private water utilities performance indicators

5 March 2024

1 What are the performance indicators?

IPART monitors 3 major public water utilities, and 30 private water licensees^a licensed under the *Water Industry Competition Act 2006* (WIC Act) in NSW to check that they comply with their licence conditions. We collect annual performance data from each utility.

2 Why do we monitor?

We publish the annual performance data to ensure transparency, improve public confidence, provide additional incentives to the utilities to perform to expectations, and enable identification of areas for improvement.

3 How do we monitor?

The Excel workbook (database) presents performance indicator data from 2012-13 to 2022-23.

We use performance indicators to measure each utilities' performance against the conditions of their licences, the requirements of the relevant legislation and regulation, and in making regulatory decisions.

As of 30 June 2023. During 2022–23, the licences of 2 licensees –Altogether Green Square Pty Ltd (15_031) and Suez Water and Treatment Solutions Pty Ltd (16_038 and 16_039R) were cancelled at their request. Licenses were approved for Kooragang Water Pty Ltd (22_046 and 22_047R).
