IPART's establishment


- Established 1992 "Government Pricing Tribunal"
 - ✓ Pre-Hilmer
 - Regulated Government-owned businesses
- Unusual step for the time
 - Most regulators regulated private monopolies

20 Years on...


What have we achieved?

- Policy review and development


Index of Household Charges




Electricity Network Capital Expenditure




Electricity Distribution Network Capex



Electricity Distribution Network Capex




Sydney Water Capex – incl Desal

TFP of electricity distribution networks





Sydney Water - Change in TFP (opportunity cost of capital included)




Service Quality - Electricity




Service Quality - Water




Agency Profitability






Price Restructure - Water




