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Your submission for this review:

Hello, I love the idea of moving to Time of Day Feed in Tariffs. Your benchmarks are an important step. I believe there is a step missing from this and previous calculations around FITs. That is that all the energy fed in under these tariffs would qualify as "green". All our utilities charge at least \$0.02 (and up to \$0.08) to customers wanting such a product. Google tells me about 10% of customers opt-in to this extra tariff so it is a significant sum. Now, I have never seen a satisfactory accounting of "green" energy from any of our utilities but there may be a premium available to retailers for energy fed in from domestic solar and your accounting and review of FITs makes no mention of it. I suspect the correct answer to this is very complicated, hidden from view and likely irresolvable in your timescale. However, I think it should rate a mention as any benefit falls on the side of the retail/wholesalers, not the consumer.
