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Your submission for this review:

The report has ignored several fundamental issues for embedded electricity: 1 Ease of retail competition - currently if a consumer opts out and gets another retailer the embedded network supplier still bills wholesale energy plus network costs. 2 Lack of competition means consumers can't get time of use tariffs or bundle services (eg electricity and gas) -- these issues are dealt with in embedded telecommunication networks retail competition provisions. This would be a simple way to do it, especially as both electricity and data are often delivered in parallel - one on electricity cables and the other on fibre or copper. 3 Use of solar energy generated in the network - currently the retailer can on-sell this at retail rates even though it has cost them nothing. This is ignored in the draft.
