What is this? I think this is forcing people to use the services against the their will, this is a major problem, I have no answer how we can solve this problem, maybe all special purpose vehicle drivers especially if its a bus should be on fixed wages or on a hourly rate and they do only wheel chair jobs that way all the wheel chair passengers will have their own taxi for themselves only and the drivers will be compelled to that job, at the same time the drivers know that they dont have to run around looking for extra jobs other than wheelchair jobs to make a living, this wheel chair taxis especially the bus should be controlled and owned by the nsw government and controlled by the point to point transport. By the way all the wheel chair taxis should have only three able bodied seats so that they do not do maxi taxi jobs and they are to be restricted not to use the taxi ranks only to pick up and drop passengers. If the taxi companies want to run maxi taxis they should be allowed without any wheelchair access and with the a maximum eleven passengers, the fares of the maxi taxis should be left as it is the fares for the wheelchair passengers should be on ttss vouchers and the other half of the should go to the the government to pay towards the drivers wages .all wheel chair taxis should have clearly marked in their bus in bold letters that these special purpose vehicles are for wheelchair passengers only. As for people who are in wheelchair and do not have the ttss vouchers, they can still book through the system to be created by the point to point transport and they have to pay for their trip before they get picked up as in other words wheel chair taxis will be only for wheelchair passengers and it will be easier for them to get the taxis, once the driver of the wheelchair taxi is logged in or all drivers will have their hours determined by the point to point and during this time they have to be available to whichever job they are given to do even if they have to run a long way out of the area which they are in . They cannot refuse a fare because they are on hourly rate ,the fuel to run these vehicles will be provided by the point to point transport .my honest view yes the wheelchair taxis needs a change. Its not working not with the way they are running now. There is no fair system and it will only be fair and the when the government starts running it.
