# Community Urged to Make Voice Heard

Ratepayers are being urged to voice their opinions on a proposed rate rise of approximately 5% from 2014/2015 to help maintain community services at their current levels.

A short survey on the issue has been available online and at Council's libraries and its main office since early December but it will close on January 24 – and anyone who has not yet completed the poll is being urged to take part.

"We're looking to raise additional funds so that we can continue to provide the services the community wants at the present levels. Earlier consultation with residents has made clear that they want to keep the current levels of services," said Steve McGrath, Council's General Manager.

"We look after around \$2 billion worth of public assets for the community - such as 800 kilometres of roads, 300 buildings, 55 playgrounds and 200 kilometres of stormwater pipes. Over many years, ratepegging by the NSW Government and cost-shifting by both the State and Federal

governments has forced us to divert money - that could have been used to maintain and renew this infrastructure - to other necessary works and programmes.

"As a result, we can't keep the community's assets in a useable condition unless we can generate additional rate revenue and, if the infrastructure isn't useable, we can't continue to provide the services the public

"So Council is very keen to hear the community's views on a proposal to ask the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) to approve a rate increase above the statewide Rate Peg increase, which would generate an additional \$6.2 million in rate revenue after the first three years."

By the third year, this would mean that the average residential ratepayer - based on a land valuation of \$183,700 - would be paying approximately \$165.29 per year, or \$3.18 per week, more than if just the Rate Peg increase was applied over the same period.
