## WHAT

Local infrastructure contributions plans set out the local infrastructure required to meet demand from new development, and the contributions a council can levy on developers to fund the land and works.

IPART assesses contributions plans that propose contributions above \$30,000 per lot or dwelling in identified greenfield areas and \$20,000 per dwelling in other areas.

An IPART-reviewed contributions plan entitles the council to levy the full contributions amount.

## HOW

We assess whether the contributions plan meets the criteria in the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment's Practice Note:

- ▼ Are all items of infrastructure on the essential works list?
- ▼ Is the infrastructure needed to meet demand from new development?
- ▼ Are the cost estimates reasonable?
- ▼ Can the infrastructure be provided in a reasonable timeframe?
- ▼ Are the costs reasonably apportioned?
- ▼ Did the council consult appropriately?

We publish a draft report on our assessment and accept submissions for a period of four weeks after the draft report is placed on our website.

We then publish a final report on our website, and provide it to the Minister for

Planning and Public Spaces and the council.

## WHY

IPART's role is intended to bring greater transparency and accountability to setting local development contributions.

## WHEN

We aim to assess plans within six months of receiving the council's application.

Any information gaps in the council's application could extend the timeframe for our review.

## WHAT NEXT

The applicant council must submit the contributions plan for assessment to IPART with a complete application form and supporting documents.
